Winnipeg's real GDP grew by 2.1% in 2022,

9th highest compared to 13 major CMAs across

Canada. Due economic imbalances caused by
the COVID-19 pandemic and Russia's invasion
of Ukraine, inflation in 2022 was at its highest
level since the early 1980s which prompted the
Bank of Canada to aggressively raise interest
rates to bring inflation back to its 2% target
level. As a result, Oxford Economics is
forecasting Winnipeg's real GDP mildly
contracted by -0.4% in 2023 (ranked 12th). For
2024-2027 Winnipeg's real GDP growth is
expected to average 2.6% for a ranking of 2nd.

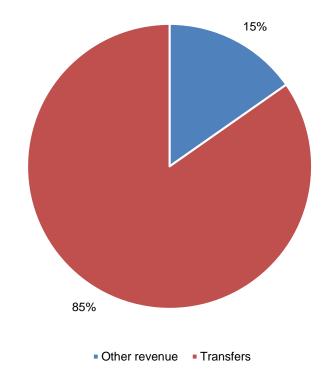
# Service Based Operating Budget



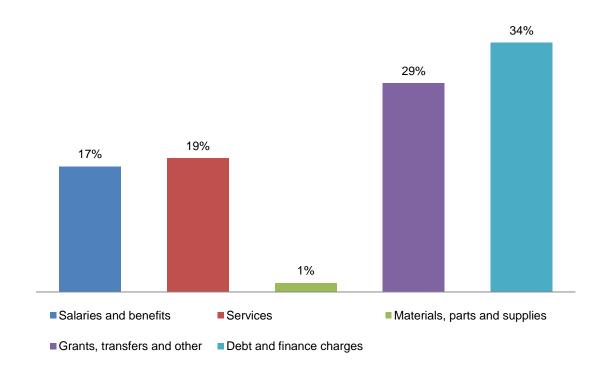
# **2024 Budget Overview**
