Your Vote

Are you an eligible voter?

You can vote in the election, if:

- You are a Canadian citizen.
- You are at least 18 years of age .
- You have lived in the City of Winnipeg since April 27, 2010.
- You do not live in the City of Winnipeg, but you owned or rented property in the City since April 27, 2010.
- You are not prohibited from voting under any law.

You can vote for:

- one candidate for Mayor
- one candidate for Councillor **AND**
- up to four candidates for School Trustee.

Note: If you do not live in Winnipeg,
you cannot vote for School Trustee

When can you vote?

- Election Day is Wednesday, October 27.
- Voting places are open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.
- You can vote in advance beginning Monday, October 4 through to Friday, October 22 at the malls, shopping centres, universities and local community centres..

Are you on the Voters List?

- If your name is on the Voters List, a voters notice will be mailed to you by early October.
- If your name is not on the Voters List, when you attend the voting place you will be required to present identification and take an oath affirming that you are an eligible voter.

Where can you vote?

- Refer to the 2010 Election site -

- Your Voters Notice outlines where you vote on Election Day, as well as provides advance voting opportunities.
- Remember to bring your Voters Notice **AND** identification with you to the voting place.
- If a voter is unable to go in person to a voting station, they may apply to vote by Sealed Envelope Ballot. Call 311 for more info on voting by mail.

Your Vote

What type of identification is required?

The City of Winnipeg requires all voters to provide identification at voting places.

Voters will be asked to provide:

- one piece of photo identification that contains their name and address, **or**
- two other pieces of identification, one of which must contain their address.

Examples of other acceptable documents are

- Manitoba Health Services Commission card, Manitoba Blue Cross card, a blank personalized cheque, a credit card statement, an Income Tax Assessment statement or a utility bill.

Your Vote

How do you mark the ballot?

Candidates' names appear in random order as determined by a draw held by the Senior Election Official following the close of nominations.

To mark the ballot, the voter must fill in the circle

Your Vote

What is automated voting?

Automated voting is the use of machines which scan the ballots and provide for quick and accurate counting of the votes.

The AVM reads the ballot as it is deposited into the ballot box and increases the number count by one, stores the information and prints cumulative totals of all votes cast after the close of voting.

Your Vote

Accessible voting – What are your options?

The Ballot Marking Device services accessible voters (voters who cannot mark a paper ballot with a pen, and require the unit's Ballot Marker Device to generate a marked ballot).



The accessible voter uses the Audio-Tactile Interface, Sip and Puff Device or Paddle Button Device and the headphones to navigate their way through the audio ballot.

Accessibility voting options

(cont'd)

After the voter has confirmed their selections, the Ballot Marking Device will print a paper copy of their marked ballot for them.

Audio voting is available at the City Hall Advance and advance voting locations in Malls and Universities.

Braille templates, along with large print listings of candidates, are also available in all voting places.

A person may request assistance from an Election Officer or a companion when voting.

Your Vote

When are the results of the Election available?

- At the close of voting, 8:00 p.m., Election Day an Election Officer will cause the voting machine to tabulate the votes cast and transport the results to Election Headquarters.
- The election results will be reported by the Senior Election Official within 120 minutes of the close of voting.
- The results will be published on the 2010 election web site.
