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# **Guidelines for Use**

# What is the Lifeguard Observation?

The Lifeguard Observation sheet is a tool to provide timely, constructive feedback to Lifeguards in the workplace. The purpose of the observation is to identify positive behaviors, lifeguarding practices and techniques, and effective interaction with co-workers and the general public. The goal is to provide information to the Lifeguard on ways to further advance their Lifeguarding skills and contribute to a safe and fun aquatic experience for the patrons we serve.

# When is the Lifeguard Observation Used?

The Lifeguard Observation is used by an Evaluator (Head Instructor Guard or Pool Supervisor) during the time the Lifeguard is on duty. The observation is done independently by the Evaluator from a distance so as not to distract the Lifeguard on duty.

Observations should cover a full 10 - 15 minutes or a position change in the rotation. Lifeguard Observations should occur twice a year for each Lifeguard and in advance of the annual performance reviews.

# **Recording Recommendations**

Evaluators are to keep the comments in a positive manner as this is not a formal evaluation. Areas of concern, that are not safety violations, should be presented as an area that needs improvement.

Confirmation of correct actions and interactions are encouraged to reinforce good work performance and public interaction.

# **Debriefing**

When the Lifeguard is off duty, the Evaluator takes a brief 5 minute meeting to review the observation with the Lifeguard. Debriefing should occur in an area removed from the public and other staff to respect the privacy of the conversation.

# **Safety Violations**

Any safety violations observed are to be addressed immediately. Safety violations are recorded in accordance with the Performance Tracking form.

# File

Signatures on the Lifeguard Observation form indicate that the debriefing has occurred. All forms are to be submitted to the Pool Supervisor for safe filing and future reference. Forms should not be shared with anyone other than the Lifeguard and Evaluator.
