PART D - SUPPLEMENTAL CONDITIONS

Clarification of D17: It was stated at the Site Investigation, January 4, 2007 that the date of Substantial

Performance is March 15, 2007. This was incorrect and the date of Substantial

Performance is March 31, 2007 as set out in D17.1.

PART E - SPECIFICATIONS

Add: E10.3.8 Grass or turf, or other existing facilities between the top of graded bank and the road

damaged as part of the Work shall be restored in accordance with applicable City of

Winnipeg Standard Construction Specifications.

Replace: E19.2 (c) Stockpiles of material beyond the top of bank will be permitted provided the amount of

material and setback distance from the top of bank are such that stability of the riverbank is not compromised. The locations and sizes of stockpiles shall be reviewed with the Contract Administrator prior to developing. Stockpile areas shall be restored in accordance with E10 and other applicable City of Winnipeg Standard Construction

Specifications.

Further to E14.2.5, an inventory of tree species to be removed is not available. Bidders are encouraged to conduct their own inventory of trees to be removed, based on the drawings, and are expected to be familiar with applicable disposal requirements.
