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## **SECURITY BARS ON RESIDENTIAL WINDOWS**

### **NOTE:**

This informational bulletin applies to a building that is:

- 1) a residential occupancy, or contains a residential occupancy;
- 2) is not more than 3 storeys in building height (excluding basements); and
- 3) is not more than 600 m<sup>2</sup> (6,458 ft<sup>2</sup>) in building area (per floor).

### ***Are fixed or lockable security bars permitted on windows?***

Fixed or lockable security bars are not permitted on a bedroom window, unless a bedroom door provides access directly to the exterior. Article 9.7.1.3 of the Manitoba Building Code requires each bedroom to have an outside window which provides an unobstructed opening and which must be openable from the inside without tools or special knowledge.

This requirement is to ensure the window is made available for emergency escape or rescue in the event of a fire where a person is not able to reach the exit door.

Hinged or removable window guards that can be operated or removed from the inside without tools or special knowledge such as removing a pin, may be acceptable. Check with your Building Inspector or Fire Prevention Officer.

Fixed or lockable security bars are not permitted on fire fighting access panels. The fire department requires access panels in every unsprinklered building up to three storeys in building height. An access panel shall be located on every storey in not less than one wall facing on a street and shall be readily openable from both inside and outside or be glazed with plain glass. This requirement is to ensure fire-fighters have access to each storey of a building to fight a fire.
