Dutch Elm Disease Control**

Notice is hereby given that necessary Elm tree removals will be undertaken by The City of Winnipeg, Urban Forestry Branch, on private lands as required. This will necessitate entry by the City or its agents onto private property. The City may enter these lands under provisions of the Forest Health Protection Act.

The City of Winnipeg is attempting to limit the spread of Dutch Elm Disease within its boundaries. This ongoing program includes the removal of dead, dying and diseased Elm trees from both public and private property throughout the year. These removals are required under agreements with the Province of Manitoba and are in accordance with the Forest Health Protection Act.

Removals will occur, at no charge, as trees are identified or as soon as possible thereafter. Trees requiring removal will be marked between June and September with orange flagging tape or paint or will be identified by removal crews during operations.

Citizens are reminded that suspect Elm trees should be reported between June and September; that the pruning of Elm trees is prohibited between April 1 and July 31 and that storage of Elm wood is illegal.
