Saturday and Sunday: 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

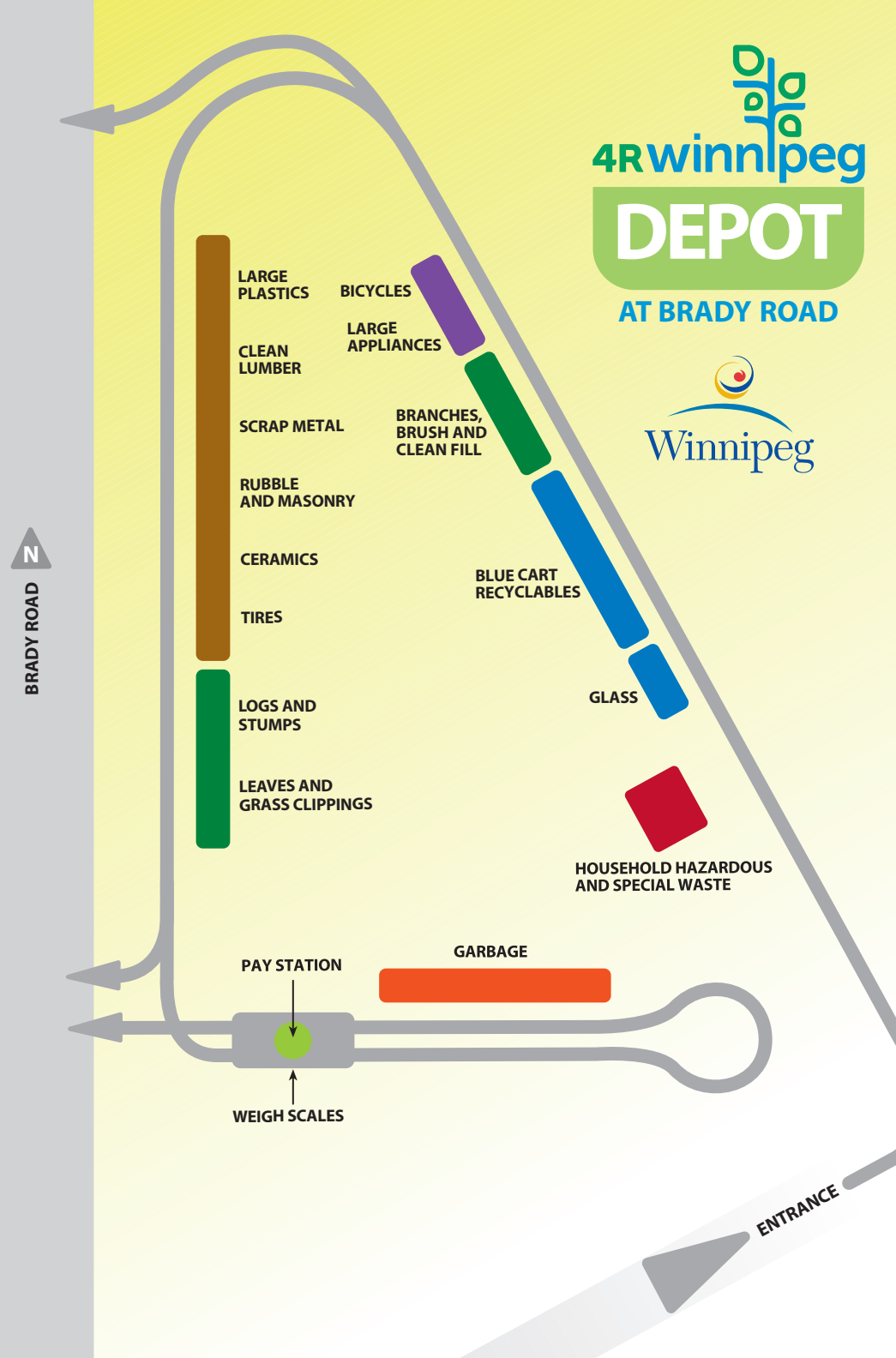
### Winter hours (November – March)\*

## \$63 PER TONNE/\$15 MINIMUM CHARGE\*

Materials that currently cannot be recycled, reused, composted or resold will be accepted in the garbage area.

You will be charged for all materials dropped off in the garbage area, based on the weight of your load.

# Accepted materials

FREE DROP OFF

## Household Hazardous and Special Waste

- **Batteries**  
Single-use, rechargeable, automotive
- **Electronic waste**  
Televisions, computers and computer equipment, audio and video equipment, phones, cell phones, microwaves
- **Household hazardous waste**  
Household cleaners, fluorescent lights, propane tanks, paint, herbicides/pesticides
- **Motor oil, filters, and containers**

## Recycling and Reuse

- **Bicycles**
- **Blue cart recyclables**  
Newspaper, household paper, cardboard, plastic containers, metal cans
- **Ceramics**  
Dishes, tiles, sinks, toilets
- **Clean fill**  
Soil, sod, clay, sand
- **Clean lumber**  
Non-treated/non-painted lumber, wood, off cuts, pallets
- **Glass**  
Bottles, jars, windows without frames, glassware, broken glass

- **Large appliances**  
Stoves, fridges, freezers, washers, dryers, dishwashers
- **Large plastics**  
Buckets, plant pots, storage containers, plastic patio furniture, laundry baskets – no metal components, tarps or bags
- **Rubble and masonry**  
Brick, asphalt, patio stones, gravel, concrete – no rebar
- **Tires**
- **Scrap metal**  
Small appliances, pots, pans, chain link fencing, BBQs

## Compostables

- **Branches and brush**  
Branches less than 10 centimetres in diameter
- **Leaves and grass clippings**
- **Logs and stumps**

# Packing tips

- Pack similar materials together in your vehicle/trailer.
- Review the map showing the order of the bins before you pack your vehicle.
- Remember: “first in, last out”. The first materials you pack in your vehicle are the last materials you will want to take out.

## HERE IS THE ORDER WE RECOMMEND YOU PACK MATERIALS INTO YOUR VEHICLE

- First:** Garbage
- Second:** Ceramics, clean lumber, large plastics, leaves and grass clippings, logs and stumps, rubble and masonry, scrap metal, tires
- Third:** Bicycles, branches, clean fill, large appliances
- Fourth:** Blue cart recyclables, glass
- Last:** Household hazardous and special waste

## YOU MAY BRING YOUR MATERIALS IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING VEHICLES/ATTACHMENTS

- Cars
- Pickup trucks
- Vans
- Single axle utility trailers\*

*\*Self-dumping trailers must be unloaded manually*

Vehicles pulling trailers with more than one axle will not be admitted to the 4R Winnipeg Depots and must use the main landfill entrance. Tipping fees will apply to the entire load.
