Engagement Updates

Dublin Avenue Bridge Replacement and Regional Street Improvements

The Dublin Avenue Bridge over Omand's Creek is in poor condition and needs to be replaced. Bridge replacement will be coordinated with improvements to nearby roadways, including the reconstruction of Dublin Avenue from St. James Street to Midland Street and the

rehabilitation of St. James Street from Saskatchewan Avenue to Notre Dame Avenue. It is anticipated that most construction activity will be in 2020. However, construction of a new bridge on Dublin at Omand's Creek is planned for the winter of 2019-2020.
