New Information

Residential Food Waste Collection Pilot Project

The City of Winnipeg (City) will begin a two-year Residential Food Waste Collection Pilot Project in October 2020. During the pilot, we will collect food waste from homes in several areas of Winnipeg. Approximately 4,000 homes from five neighbourhoods will be selected to participate. City Council is currently reviewing an update on the development and implementation of the pilot project.

Public engagement opportunities are planned to start in fall 2020. The public engagement during the pilot project will be used to inform recommendations towards a citywide program.

Crescentwood Heritage Conservation District Nomination

The Crescentwood neighbourhood was nominated for Heritage Conservation District (HCD) designation. Once an area is nominated, an HCD study must be prepared and submitted to demonstrate how the proposed district is architecturally and historically significant and warrants designation.
