


Glenwood Neighbourhood Infill Planning



Infill development is an important aspect of renewing and revitalizing Winnipeg's mature communities. In Glenwood, where significant infill housing has occurred over the past 10 years, it has also contributed to many issues for the neighbourhood.

The City of Winnipeg is now developing a Planned Development Overlay (PDO) to strengthen the Residential Infill Guidelines in Glenwood. The PDO will help reinforce parts of the guidelines related to character of houses, privacy, sunlight, landscaping, and trees by putting them into regulations.

3. Arthur Street Between Bannatyne Avenue and Notre Dame Avenue
