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G SERVICE IMPROVEMENTS

Since September 2000, students enrolled at the University of Manitoba have been able to purchase monthly bus passes for 20% less than the price of the regular Adult monthly pass.

Instead of this discounted monthly pass, a different concept is one where all students would pay a transportation levy as part of their student fees. You would be permitted to ride a Winnipeg Transit bus at any time, on any day, just by showing your validated student card. Additionally, money generated by the transportation levy would be used to fund improvements to Transit service to the University.
