The Minister of Transport has determined that your work is not likely to substantially interfere with navigation.

Therefore, your work is permitted under the NPA Section 9(1), and you may proceed pursuant to the attached plan(s) Dwg. 01, 02, REV B, in accordance with the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Warning signs stating "Construction Ahead" and "Travaux de construction" shall be:
 - Be legible at a minimum distance of 75 meters.
 - Be placed and maintained during all periods of open water and in stream activity.
 - Be placed on shoreline 50 meters upstream and downstream of the site until completion of the project.
 - Display black letters on a yellow background.
- Instream silt curtains placed during open water ice free conditions shall be marked, from dusk to dawn and during periods of restricted visibility, with yellow flashing lights that are located on each end of the works and at any other location on the works so that the lights are spaced not more than 20 m apart.
- 3. Any proposed changes shall be reviewed and accepted by Navigation Protection Program prior to implementation of the same.

This permission relates only to the effect of your work on navigation under the NPA and does not grant any rights related to the ownership of the bed of the waterway.

It is the owner's responsibility to comply with any other applicable laws and regulations.

Please note that the NPA, amongst other obligations, requires the owner to immediately notify the Minister if his work causes or is likely to cause serious or imminent danger to navigation and take reasonable measures to remediate the danger to navigation (section 12 of the NPA).
