## 1.0 INTENT-

- 1.1 It is the intent of these specifications is to describe the (7) month rental of (4) street sweepers.

  The rental shall include full service and maintenance of the entire machines including conveyors to be performed by the Contractor throughout the entire duration of the rental period.
- 1.2 The rental street sweepers shall be the manufacturer's latest model as may be modified by these specifications. The street sweepers shall be furnished complete and ready for use. Any parts not specifically mentioned, but which are required to complete and place the sweepers into successful operation, shall be furnished as though specifically mentioned in these specifications. The complete units, and all parts thereof, shall conform in strength and quality of material and workmanship, to the best standards and engineering practice of the industry.

8.1 Where applicable, all equipment must be fully fueled upon delivery (no exceptions).

#### 9.0 QUALIFICATIONS OF MANUFACTURER & CONTRACTOR

- 9.1 The manufacturer of the **Street Sweepers** shall have five (5) years continuous experience manufacturing the equipment.
- 9.2 The manufacturer shall have in effect a documented quality control program ensuring that the quality of materials and workmanship, including welding, conforms to the best standards and engineering practice of the industry.

#### 10.0 TERMS-

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- 10.2 Bidders shall state the rental costs for a 7 month rental commencing April 1, 2018 to October 31, 2018, as indicated on Form B: PRICES. The monthly rates shall include the cost of a full maintenance and service contract. The Contractor shall be responsible for maintenance of the complete machines including replacement of any components that fail during normal operation of the machines.
- 10.3 For equipment rental under this Contract, the Contractor shall repair or rectify any defects in workmanship, construction and materials, and shall repair or replace without additional cost to the City, any component that has become defective and not proven to have been caused by negligence on the part of the user throughout the entire duration of the rental Contract.
- The street sweepers are of vital importance to the City in providing essential services and, accordingly, all repair items brought to the attention of the Contractor by the City shall be rectified within (three) 3-Calendar Days. The City reserves the right to affect repairs to the equipment, at full cost to the Contractor, should the Contractor fail to perform in a timely manner.
