POST-SECONDARY SCHOLARSHIP

DEADLINE: August 23, 2024

Scholarships in the amount of \$1,000.00 will be awarded to Indigenous students who are enrolled in full-time post-secondary education at a recognized post-secondary institution in Winnipeg.

Post-Secondary Educational Institutions include all Universities, Community Colleges and Trades Schools in Winnipeg that provide degrees, diplomas and certificates.

The \$1,000.00 scholarship is provided to students to assist with tuition expenses and is provided directly to the institution on the student's behalf.

Eligibility Criteria

The scholarship will be awarded based on the following:

- Must be of Indigenous descent (First Nations (status or non-status), Métis, or Inuit);
- An Indigenous youth up to 30 years of age;
- Must provide proof of registration at a recognized post-secondary institution, in Winnipeg, in a full-time program starting in Fall of the current year. Full-time is defined by the educational institution;
- Demonstrates passion for their chosen post-secondary program and academic journey.
