1. Treaty One was signed at Lower Fort Garry BEFORE or AFTER Winnipeg became a city?

Answer: Before. Treaty One was signed at Lower Fort Garry on August 3, 1871. Winnipeg officially became a city on November 8, 1873.

2. Winnipeg's first municipal election was held BEFORE or AFTER the fur trading post of Fort Rouge was built?

Answer: After. Winnipeg's first municipal election was held on January 5, 1874. Fort Rouge was built in 1738.

3. Louis Riel led the Red River Resistance BEFORE or AFTER the first train over the Canadian Pacific Railway from Montreal to Vancouver came to Winnipeg?

Answer: Before. Louis Riel led the Red River Resistance in 1869-70. The first train over the Canadian Pacific Railway from Montreal to Vancouver came to Winnipeg on July 1, 1886.

4. Winnipeg hosted the fifth Pan American Games BEFORE or AFTER the first Folklorama was held?

Answer: Before. Winnipeg hosted the fifth Pan American Games in 1967. The first Folklorama was held in 1970.

5. The Forks Market opened BEFORE or AFTER the Red River Floodway was opened?

Answer: After. The Forks Market was opened on October 4, 1989. The Red River Floodway was opened in 1968.

6. Winnipeg hosted the North American Indigenous Games BEFORE or AFTER the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada held its first national event at The Forks?

Answer: Before. Winnipeg hosted the North American Indigenous Games July 25 to August 4, 2002. The Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada held its first national event at The Forks July 16 to 19, 2010.

7. The first street railway system, an early form of public transit, was established BEFORE or AFTER the Greater Winnipeg Aqueduct was built?

Answer: Before. The first street railway system was established in 1882. The Greater Winnipeg Aqueduct was completed on April 5, 1919.

8. The Winnipeg General Strike occurred BEFORE or AFTER Assiniboine Park was included in city limits?

Answer: After. The Winnipeg General Strike occurred May 15 to June 26, 1919. Assiniboine Park was included in city limits in 1905.

9. Susan A. Thompson became the first woman to be elected as Mayor of Winnipeg BEFORE or AFTER the “Flood of the Century”?

Answer: Before. Susan A. Thompson became the first woman to be elected as Mayor of Winnipeg on October 28, 1992. The “Flood of the Century” took place April to May 1997.

10. Canadian Museum for Human Rights opened BEFORE or AFTER Winnipeg City Council passed a bylaw for the delivery of municipal services in French and English?

Answer: After. The Canadian Museum for Human Rights opened on September 20, 2014. Winnipeg City Council passed a bylaw for the delivery of municipal services in French and English on April 28, 1994.

11. The Rural Municipality of Kildonan was split into West Kildonan and East Kildonan BEFORE or AFTER the Town of Transcona was created?

Answer: After. The Rural Municipality of Kildonan was split into West Kildonan and East Kildonan in 1914. The Town of Transcona was created in 1912.

12. The Elm Park Bridge was opened BEFORE or AFTER the Charleswood Bridge?

Answer: Before. The Elm Park Bridge was opened in 1912. The Charleswood Bridge was opened on October 24, 1995.
