**These events are all out of order. Can you match them with the correct dates on page 3? Use the timeline in the *Winnipeg 150 in the classroom* booklet to check your answers.**

1. \_\_\_\_\_ First day of the Winnipeg General Strike.
2. \_\_\_\_\_ Winnipeg is incorporated; four wards with three Aldermen (now known as Councillors) for each ward.
3. \_\_\_\_\_ First civic election with adult suffrage in effect.
4. \_\_\_\_\_ After eight days of negotiation, Treaty No. 1 is signed at Lower Fort Garry between the Crown and seven Anishinaabe (Ojibwe) and Inineu (Cree) First Nations: the Brokenhead Ojibway Nation, Sagkeeng Anicinabe Nation, Long Plain First Nation, Peguis First Nation, Roseau River Anishinaabe First Nation, Sandy Bay Ojibway First Nation, and Swan Lake First Nation.
5. \_\_\_\_\_ Last street car line – Portage Avenue and Main Street – is discontinued and street cars are replaced with diesel buses.
6. \_\_\_\_\_ First meeting of Winnipeg's City Council is held.
7. \_\_\_\_\_ Battle of Seven Oaks, or the Victoria at Frog Plain, takes place.

8. \_\_\_\_\_ “Recognition and Remembrance Day for Aboriginal Veterans” (now known as Indigenous Veterans Day) is first proclaimed.
  
9. \_\_\_\_\_ The Canadian Museum for Human Rights opens, the first national museum to be built outside of Ottawa.
  
10. \_\_\_\_\_ The Forks Market is opened.
  
11. \_\_\_\_\_ Winnipeg elects its first Mayor and Council.
  
12. \_\_\_\_\_ Winnipeg’s new Civic Centre (the present City Hall) is officially opened.
  
13. \_\_\_\_\_ Greater Winnipeg Aqueduct is completed and water from Shoal Lake is piped into Winnipeg water mains.
  
14. \_\_\_\_\_ Susan A. Thompson becomes the first woman to be elected as Mayor of Winnipeg.
  
15. \_\_\_\_\_ Inaugural meeting of the first council of the new unified City of Winnipeg takes place.
