


The Winnipeg Police Service 2017 Annual Statistical Report shows that crime rates continue to rise in our community. Violent crime is up by 7%. Property crime by 9%. And drug crime has risen 15%. The reason behind the increase is due in large part to the growing use of methamphetamine and the pattern of violence associated with the illicit drug trade.

As an organization, the Winnipeg Police Service is adapting to meet this challenge. We have implemented strategies and dedicated more officers to focus on this growing epidemic. I am proud of the commitment and dedication shown by our sworn and civilian members to solve an issue that to many families has become a crisis, but we can't do this alone. We will continue to work with our partners in the community, and in government. And together, we can make a stand against a plague that is claiming too many lives, and causing too much violence.




## Population vs. Police Officers

## Police Officers / 100 000 Population




## Crime Type Overview



**DATA NOTE:** All data for 2017 and historical data from 2012-2016 were restated to reflected systemic updates in methodology and improved quality assurance. Historic data contained within this report should not be compared to data reported in previous *WPS Annual Statistical Reports*.







## Criminal Code Traffic Violations/ 100 000 †









**Total Dispatched Events by Day <sup>4,9</sup>**








Police-initiated Events by Day







# ORGANIZATIONAL CHART




