AND WHEREAS there is a Royal Canadian Legion located at 6003 Roblin Boulevard with over 650 members, many of which utilize public transit;

THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Standing Policy Committee on Infrastructure Renewal and Public Works be requested to direct the Winnipeg Public Service to conduct a traffic study to determine if an overhead flashing beacon pedestrian corridor is warranted at Roblin Boulevard at Municipal Road.
