The impact of COVID-19 on Brady


- Have maintained on-site operations without disruption
- Continuing mask use and social distancing to keep customers and staff safe
- Residential volumes have returned to normal
- From April 22 to May 31, we have received 271 mm of rain onsite



Landscaping and Long-term Site Planning

- Continue working with the Province on replacements for trees lost due to service road construction
 - Planted an additional 187 trees/shrubs on the lime-mud berm
- Continue working with City Naturalists to monitor success of trees and shrubs planted on lime mud berms
- Cell 30 has been seeded with prairie grasses
- Plan for landscaping around admin building complete (on next slide)










Odour, Noise and Nuisance Management

- Received 1 odour complaint since last meeting
- Litter control continues
 - Using wind fencing
 - New Directions helping with litter
- Looking at an alternative to daily cover by using a spray on product called Posi Shell (clay binders mixed with water)

Site Improvements, Seasonal & Project Activity

- New service road/access to Brady in use
- Cell 33 construction was finished and operational at the beginning of September 2021
- 2022 curbside yard waste collection season started May 9 for week A, May 16 for week B
- Switching to summer hours of operation on May 23, 2022



Reducing the Impact on the Environment

- More LFG wells are online in new areas of the landfill
 - Using horizontal collection lines in new cells to maximize efficiency
 - Each of the LFG gas wells has a pneumatic pump to help de-water the site and maximize gas collection



Research Partnerships & Resource Development

- Landfill gas beneficial use study
 - Proposal 1 is to sell the raw resource landfill gas to IGRS, who would then process RNG and distribute it through Centra Gas Manitoba Inc. to interested end users.
 - Proposal 2 is to sell the raw resource landfill gas to IGRS who would then process and sell treated LFG to the University of Manitoba.

New business

- Residential Food Waste Collection Pilot Project continues until September 2022
 - Food waste is being incorporated with LYW and new gore cover system is being used (pictured in next slide)
- Compost giveaway event planned for May 13 15, at three locations.
 - Compost is:
 - Used on-site
 - Used by other city departments
 - Donated to community gardens
 - Sold to local landscapers
- Spring giveaway weekend May 14 and 15
